Past progressive

Used to show that an action was ongoing in the past. Often used to describe the background of a story. e.g.

I was writing a letter this morning.

Present perfect


Used to show that something happened in the past that has a relationship with the present. e.g.

My teacher can't tell me off because I have written my letter.

Past perfect

Used to make it clear that one event happened before another in the past. e.g.

Before I went to school, I had written a letter to my pen pal.



Present progressive

Used to show that something is currently happening.

e.g.

Right at this moment, <u>I am writing</u> a letter.

Past perfect progressive

Used to show that an action started at one point in the past and continued until another point in the past.

e.g.

<u>I had been writing</u> a letter until my brother snatched my pen away from me.

Present perfect progressive

Used to show that an action started in the past and is continuing up to the present moment.

e.g.

<u>I have been writing</u> a letter all morning.

Verb form	Example	How to form it
Past progressive	I was writing/ they were writing	I was/ he was/ she was/ you were/ we were/ they were + present participle
Present progressive	I am writing/ he is writing/ they are writing	I am/ he is/ she is/ you are/ we are/ they are + present participle
Past perfect	I had written	I had/ he had/ she had/ you had/ we had/ they had + past participle
Present perfect	I have written/ he has written	I have/ you have/ we have/ they have/ he has/ she has + past participle
Past perfect progressive	I had been writing	I had/ we had/ you had/ they had/ he had/ she had + been + present participle
Present perfect progressive	I have been writing/ he has been writing	I have/ you have/ we have/ they have/ he has/ she has + been + present participle
